ANDREW WYETH - a large book describing and reproducing in lovely color many of the paintings of this outstanding artist

THE READER'S ADVISOR - 2 volumes, edited by W. F. Courtney, giving useful information on noted authors and their books

The Board also authorized the purchase of a print of Harold Grieve's charming painting of the Vetter Windmill, the historical structure which the City recently moved to Greenwood Park as a permanent landmark. This print has been appropriately framed, marked with a plaque stating, "Donated by Hermosa Beach Friends of the Library, 1969", and placed in the library.

Through a donation of one of our members, the Friends of the Library have recently installed in the library a Xerox Microfilm Reader, with a microfiche adapter. This is one of the newest models made by Xerox and anyone familiar with research will attest to its value.
